

What should I bring to my eye exam?

If another eye doctor has recommended that Dr. Finger evaluate you, the doctor may give you a note to bring to your first exam. Any other information that you have, including tests you may have already taken (photographs, ultrasound, fluorescein angiography, MRI or CT scan), would also aid in your evaluation. Having a copy of these tests sometimes prevents them from having to be duplicated.

Please also bring your most updated pair of glasses for distance (if needed) so we can measure your best vision.

We encourage all of our patients to bring a friend or family member when you see Dr. Finger. For some, it is helpful to have someone else listen to Dr. Finger's assessment and assist them in getting home because their eyes may be blurry from the dilating drops.
